What is a recorder?

You might be familiar with the recorder from elementary school. To teach you music basics as a fourth grader, as part of a pre-band program, your teacher gave you a plastic soprano. But there's a lot more to recorder playing than that!

The recorder was a popular instrument in Europe in the Medieval, Renaissance, and Baroque eras. It was referred to as the "flute" in those days. Vast amounts of literature were written for the instrument, and composers who worked with the recorder include some of the most celebrated of the time, such as Vivaldi, Bach, and Handel. Henry VIII owned 78 recorders at the time of his death in 1547, and books on how to play recorder date from the mid-16th century. By the end of the Renaissance eight recorder sizes were in common use.

Recorders fell out of favor after about 1750, as European tastes moved toward orchestral music, and modern string, brass, and woodwind instruments took the place of earlier instruments. But early in the 20th century, European and American musicians rediscovered the recorder, and the elegant music that it can create.

Play Recorder with Us

The Chicago chapter of the American Recorder Society was formed in 1959. Its members meet regularly in the Chicago area to play, learn, and perform the recorder and its music.
