Workshop Director

Lisette Kielson performs as soloist, chamber musician, and orchestral player throughout the Midwest and has released recordings with Centaur Records as well as with her own label. With a love of teaching and great passion for ensemble playing and coaching, Lisette directs the Collegium Musicum at Bradley University, is on the faculty of the Whitewater Early Music Festival, and leads recorder workshops and master classes throughout the country. Past President of the American Recorder Society, Lisette currently serves as Music Director of the ARS Chicago Chapter and Associate Director of the Recorder Orchestra of the Midwest. Lisette holds Bachelor and Master Degrees in flute performance (her second passion) from Indiana University and a post-master's Diploma in recorder performance from The Royal Conservatory of The Hague, the Netherlands.

Bloomington Center for the Performing Arts*

In 2000, the Bloomington Cultural District envisioned a new arts, entertainment, and education destination for Bloomington, Illinois. The first phase of this cultural project, the *Bloomington Center for the Performing Arts* (BCPA), opened in the fall of 2006. Prior to this transformation, Bloomington's *Scottish Rite Temple* (built in 1921) boasted an elegant lobby fronted by a graceful five-arched facade, and a theatre that featured the largest stage west of New York. The Temple was the centerpiece of Bloomington-Normal's artistic and social life. By restoring this landmark theater, the civic committee has enhanced the city's arts resources and revitalized Bloomington's downtown center.
